NOVEMBER COMES AROUND

All Saints Day (Thursday, 1st November) is a special feast day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. It is a Holyday of Obligation and we should do all in our power to attend mass and give thanks for the gift of these people. While most saints have a particular feast day in the Catholic calendar (usually, though not always, the date of their death), not all of those feast days are observed. Saints who have not been canonized—those who are in Heaven, but whose sainthood is known only to God—have no particular feast day. In a special way, All Saints Day is their feast. I know many people who have suffered the misfortune of miscarriage or the still-birth of a child pray this day to their sainted child for logic and reason tells us that they should be in heaven.

All Souls Day (Friday 2nd November) is a solemn commemoration of those who have died and are now in Purgatory. They, like us, are members of the Communion of Saints but, unlike us, do not have access to the sacraments of forgiveness: they need our prayers.

A plenary indulgence, which applies only to the Holy Souls in Purgatory, can be gained on All Souls Day. By fulfilling the conditions of the indulgence, you can release a soul from Purgatory. It's a good way to remember a family member or friend who has died in the past year, or to exercise Christian charity on behalf of a soul in Purgatory who has no one to pray for him.

A Plenary Indulgence can be gained only one per day. The faithful must be in the state of grace and these three conditions must accompany the prescribed act: to obtain the indulgence, the faithful must receive the sacrament of confession, either eight days before or after the pious act is performed, receive Holy Communion on that day and recite prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary is the minimum, but any other additional prayers may be added).

To help people get to mass on the Holy Day of Obligation and obtain the indulgence, I shall be celebrating the Eucharist on both evenings (see overleaf). This will give people time to get home from work or school and still have the evenings free. I shall be available for confessions an hour before both masses ... and, from the First Sunday of Advent, hope to be full active again with a full timetable of services.
